COMMUNITY/SCHOOL INFORMATION

The Town of Millis is a suburban town in the Charles River Valley, 26 miles southwest of Boston, 32 miles east of Worcester, and 32 miles north of Providence, RI. With a population of 8,600, Millis covers an area of 12 square miles. Millis High School is a public academic institution accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges with an enrollment of 317 students in grades 9-12. Millis High School has consistently been ranked among the top high schools in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the nation. The small size of the school truly allows staff to personalize the educational experience for each student. The school motto, "Small School, Big Family" is lived by students, staff and community alike.

CURRICULUM

Curricular offerings are available in English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Foreign Language (Spanish), Computer Science, Digital Media Production, Art, Art and New Media, Music, and Physical Education. Students are encouraged to explore courses meeting their academic ability, career goals and personal interests. Courses are offered at four ability levels: Advanced Placement, Honors, College Preparatory 1/CP1, and College Preparatory 2/CP2. All leveled courses at Millis High School are designed for students who are preparing to continue their education beyond high school. Students are expected to enroll in a minimum of 30 credits annually. Should you have any questions regarding the content of courses listed on a student's schedule, please feel free to contact the School Counseling Office or consult the *Program of Studies*, posted on the school website at hs.millisps.org.

Advanced Placement (AP) courses are available this year in the following disciplines: Human Geography, U.S. History, Psychology, US Government and Politics, English Literature & Composition, English Language & Composition, Calculus (AB), Biology, Spanish Language, Studio Art: 2-D Design, Studio Art: Drawing, and Computer Science Principles. *Students can also take online AP courses through Virtual High School (VHS) and The Education Cooperative Connections Learning (TECCL). Taking AP Exams is a requirement.

Millis High School graduation requirements include the following: A student must earn 110 credits and successfully complete 4 years of English, 3 years of Social Studies, 3 years of Mathematics, 3 years of laboratory Science (including one full year of life science and one full year of physical science), 2 years of Foreign Language, 1 semester of Health, 3 semesters of Physical Education (or equivalent).

INSTRUCTION DURING COVID-19 PANDEMIC

Millis High School implemented a fully remote learning program starting March 16, 2020. For full-year courses, as there were an adequate number of assessments from Quarter 3, students earned numeric grades for that marking period and those grades were factored into the student's final grade (and GPA). For full-year courses, the final grade was calculated by placing 36% weight on each of the first two quarters, and 28% on third quarter. Semester one classes were finished before the closure, graded as usual, and included in GPA. Semester two courses, including quarter three/four PE courses, were graded on a Pass/Fail basis and are not included in GPA. Credit was awarded for quarter, semester, or full-year classes based on successful completion of coursework and is reflected on student transcripts.

During 2020-21, students participated in either a remote or hybrid-learning model and all students returned to fully in-person learning at the end of the year. Regardless of the model, students accessed the curriculum through both synchronous and asynchronous teaching and were expected to be active participants. Our typical numerical grading policy was in place all academic year along with our entire College Preparatory, Honors and Advanced Placement curriculum. School returned to fully in-person learning for the 2021-2022 school year.

SCHEDULE

The Millis High School schedule is based on a ten-day rotation. We have seven periods in our schedule, but only six periods meet per day. In periods one through five, the schedule rotates so that each class drops for two days during the ten-day cycle. Periods six and seven meet every day. Class periods run for 63 minutes periods one through five, and periods 6 and 7 meet every day for 48 minutes each. An Advisory block and a Flex block are built into the 10-day rotating schedule.

GPA & GRADING SYSTEM

Courses are leveled according to the degree of difficulty. Advanced Placement (AP) courses are leveled at one (1). Honors and Advanced classes are leveled at two (2). College Prep 1 (CP1) are leveled at three (3). College Prep 2 (CP2) classes are leveled at four (4). All courses are weighted with the exception of pass/fail courses, Academic Skills, and courses not taken at Millis High School. The weighted score (rank index) would be the marks received, times the credits for the course, added together and divided by the total number of potential credits, equals weighted GPA (Grade Points x Potential Credits/Potential Credits = Weighted GPA). Minimum passing grade is a 60. Millis High School uses a four quarter/two-semester grading system. Final year grades are the only grades reported on the transcript. Semester grades are available at the end of January and the end of June. First quarter and mid-year grades are available to colleges. End of year, final transcripts, are sent after **graduation** (June 6, 2024).

120 MHS students took 194 Advanced Placement Exams in May 2023. Students may take an AP exam without taking the course. There is no limit on the number of AP courses a student can take. *Results include online VHS/TECCL courses.

Sophomores are required to take Fitness for Life/Introduction to Physical Education CP1, which meets every day during semester one. Elective Physical Education is available in Grades 10-12 with Leadership/Outdoor Pursuits CP1 and Physical Education II CP1. There are two elective courses offered in the Physical Education program, Stress Management CP1 (Semester 1) and Sport Psychology CP1 (Semester 2), though neither counts toward the four-year PE/Health requirement.
